Nusantara



Nusantara's mesmerising gamelan and dance performance will transport you to the stunning exotic cultures of South East Asia. In their splendid and elaborate costumes, Nusantara perform the folk and traditional court dances of the Malay, Chinese and Indian communities of Malaysia.

The gamelan's ornate instrumentation consists largely of gongs, metallophones and xylophones. With the hypnotic beats of the Malaysian drums, the gamelan orchestra produces sounds and scales indigenous to South East Asian shores. Nusantara's performance of this complex art form provides a rare glimpse into a world steeped in ancient history.

Pucho & The Latin Soul Brothers

Legendary timbales player Henry 'Pucho' Brown is a mambo King. Born in Harlem in 1938, he was exposed to the musical cross-fertilisation that produced the vibrant hybrid known as The New York Sound.

Pucho is a pivotal figure in Latin music, fusing jazz, soul and funk to give us Latin soul and boogaloo. His original 1960s recordings, on the Prestige label (Rollins, Monk and Davis), were once again celebrated in the 90s when he re-released over 8 albums to a new European generation. As the club scene embraced funk and Latin music, Pucho's popularity exploded, branding him with the prestigious title 'Father of the Acid Jazz Movement'.

Pucho has recorded over 23 albums and has collaborated with Tito Puente, James Brown, Marvin Gaye, Don Cherry, Roberta Flack and George Benson. He is also the second African American to be elected into the Latin Hall of Fame, alongside the great Dizzy Gillespie.

In the spirit of the Irish custom of musical exchange, visiting international musicians and our own Irish performers will join the Festival Club's resident musicians each night, for some truly memorable sessions. Noted musicians, Olivia McTernan (flute, whistle, song) Ciarán Mulderrig (guitar), Garry O'Meara (banjo) and Ray Dempsey (accordion) will host the sessions each evening.

Music and dance are a major force in the daily lives of the Nepalese, representing their religious, cultural and personal experiences.

Vajra Kala Kunja was founded in 1998 to promote and preserve the extraordinary culture of Nepal. They perform classical and folk dance, embodying the grace and historical significance of ancient court dances that have been performed for over a thousand years.

The Dhol Foundation

Led by Johnny Kalsi, key drummer for the Afro Celt Sound System, The Dhol Foundation create an intense mix of rhythm and sound via bhangra, dance and electronica - feeding the energy of urban clubs with their own Punjabi spirit. Since then it has taught hundreds of young British Asian's to play the dhol, while thrilling thousands of music lovers at festivals and concerts around the world with their awesome live performances. In recent months The Dhol Foundation has received International acclaim with their sound tracks on Martin Scorsese's 'Gangs of New York' and the highly acclaimed Australian film 'Rabbit Proof Fence'.

Los de Abajo

Emerging from Mexico's Latin rock scene, Los de Abajo describe their music as 'Tropi-Punk' - a combination of traditional Latin rhythms with salsa, ska, funk, rap, reggae and rock.

The group formed in 1992, taking their name ('those from below') from a classic novel about the Mexican Revolution. United by a strong leftist ideology and sense of social democracy, their ethos is to combine these sentiments with the strength and heat of Afro-Latin rhythms.

Los de Abajo signed to David Byrne's label Luaka Bop in 2001. Their internationally acclaimed album 'Cybertropic Chilango', is described as a *sonic cocktail with a tremendous punch* and earned them the prestigious 'Award for the Americas' at the BBC Radio 3 World Music Awards, earlier this year.

Vajra Kala Kunja SATURDAY 23

A rare insight into the classical (Charya) and folk dance of Nepal. The dances are both a celebration of the diversity of cultural traditions throughout the country, while also emphasising the desire, inherent in all Nepalese people, to communicate their history and traditions through dance and music.

The Classical Dance (Charya) was historically performed as a religious discipline by the Buddhist Priests of the Valley Region. The music and songs are taken from ancient scriptures; in each dance the performers become the embodiment of a particular deity.

Formed in the 1960s by a number of Welshmen settled in Dublin, the Dublin Welsh Male Voice Choir met mainly for fun and camaraderie. However, their considerable vocal talents soon became apparent and they have since performed in many prestigious venues such as The Basilica of Mont Saint Michel in Brittany, The Atlanta Dome in Georgia USA, The National Concert Hall and St Patrick's and Christ Church Cathedrals in Dublin. Under the musical directorship of Keith Young the 50 member choir has made many radio and television appearances, recorded 15 anthems and choruses for the Rugby World Cup '99, and has sung to huge audiences in Lansdowne Road for Irish-Welsh rugby ceremonies.

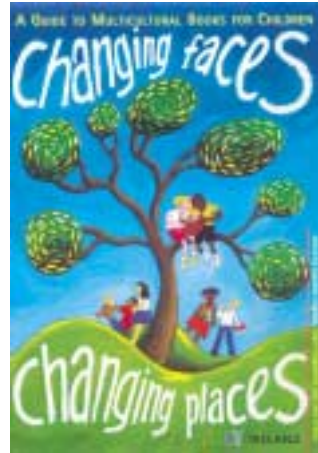
